The Campmaster corps is a group of selected, trained, and registered Scouters who serve at council weekend camp whenever Scout Units are using any part of the camp property. Campmasters select their own time and frequency of service, but they usually serve two to four times a year. The group is organized under the leadership of the Council Campmaster. The entire project and its personnel are responsible to the Scout Executive or someone appointed by the Scout Executive. The corps generally meets Quarterly to evaluate its program, schedule ahead, and arrange for the training of any new members.

Campmasters are selected on the basis of their ability in several areas: outdoor skills, specialized knowledge of nature and conservation, and leadership skills. All Campmasters must have a record of demonstrated ability to get along with people, to lead, and to act in an emergency. All Campmasters must have a working knowledge of Scouting operations, advancement, and Cub Scout camping. Experienced and registered Scouters are eligible for consideration as Campmasters.

The training prerequisite is determined by the council. It is important that the person have outdoor experience and people skills.

CAMPMASTER CHARACTERISTICS

- 1. Would have an interest in assisting troops, packs, dens and boys at camp 2-4 weekends a year.
- 2. Has ability in Scouting skills not necessarily an expert in all.
- 3. Has the ability to get along with people (very important).
- 4. Has acceptable character traits (follows the Scout Oath and Law).
- 5. Is a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America, or would upon acceptance as Campmaster.
- 6. Would take a one hour training session on how to be a successful Campmaster.
- 7. Has leadership ability and can get results.
- 8. Can size up a situation and provide necessary support.
- 9. Is dependable.
- 10. Has completed Cub Scout Leader or Boy Scout Leader or Venturing Basic Leader Training.
- 11. Has completed Youth Protection Training within the past two years & Weather Hazard training certification.

CAMPMASTERS RESPONSIBILITES

1. Check in/out Packs, Troops and Crews -

Campmaster should work with Troop SPL and the pack or troop leader.

Review rules and regulations and give out maps of camp.

- 2. Visit all campsites at least once for a friendly visit.
- 3. Give commissioner service to each unit -

Provide program resources and equipment as needed and/or available.

Be a program resource assisting with Scout craft skills.

Assign conservation projects to groups requesting such need.

4. Insure safety and security precautions are always priority –

Set example of use of wood tools, motor vehicles, etc.

Act as an emergency coordinator and record all accidents.

Check in and provide orientation to all camp visitors.

Report all trespassers to camp personnel.

Notify proper camp personnel of all potential safety hazards and maintenance needs.

- 5. Keep Campmaster quarters in good, clean condition, as well as all program resource equipment.
- 6. Record a weekly Campmaster report containing the following:

Units in camp and numbers of boys, adults and visitors.

Types of program requested or given to units.

Accidents. Maintenance Needs

7. Campmaster hours will be 6:00 pm, Friday – 1:00 pm Sunday afternoon.
