

Check-In Procedures:

- Park in the field to the left of the front gate
- Check-in at the Maintenance shed
- Transport you gear to your campsite by wagon or by hand
- Registration will be open from 3:00 to 9:00pm on Friday and 7:00 to 11:00 on Saturday at the Shed. After that, Please check in at the Admin Building.
- We highly recommend that you try and arrive before dark to check-in. Camp is not well lit and finding and setting up your campsite after dark is difficult
- All participants (Scout, adult and sibling) must wear the wristband handed out at registration the entire time at camp.
- Early check in available if you volunteer to run check in table.

Additional Information:

- Activity information, rotations and maps will be provided at check-in.
- Those who register by the early bird deadline will receive an email with any updates or additional pertinent information before the start of camp. We will try to send the same email to all those registering late, but can not guarantee it.
- Please coordinate with your Pack about arrival times, cooking in camp or dining hall, registration, supplies.
- Registration may be done individually or through your Pack. Many times, it is easier for one person to register the entire Pack—this is a good way to start volunteering with your Unit—step up and be your Pack's Fall Encampment Coordinator. Be sure to check with Pack before buying meal tickets.

Packing List:

- ♦ Tent
- Sleeping Bag (good quality, not cartoon sleepover bag) & Pad/Cot
- ♦ Tarp (to place under tent)
- Signed BSA Medical Form for each participant (Scout, adult, sibling)
- ⋄ Clothes
- Light jacket (it sometimes gets cool in the evening)
- > Personal items
- ♦ Cap or hat
- ♦ Water bottle
- ♦ Sunscreen
- ♦ Bug spray
- ♦ Flashlight
- Cash for Trading Post
- Wagon to help haul gear to campsite (optional)

No cars are allowed in campsites unless otherwise noted. Packs are allowed one vehicle pulling Pack trailer to campsite. Vehicle must be returned to parking lot once trailer is delivered and secured. Persons with handicaps needing a vehicle, please notify Camp Director for placard.

If cooking in your own campsite:

- ♦ Firewood/charcoal
- ♦ Cooking stove/BBQ
- ♦ Cooking utensils/pans/etc.
- ♦ Food/Drink
- ♦ Water/Water jugs
- Matches/Lighter
- Lanterns
- Mess Kits or paper plates and plastic silverware

NOT Allowed:

- ♦ Any explosive items
- ♦ Fireworks
- Personal firearms (including BB guns)
- ♦ Personal Bows & Arrows
- Hunting Knives
- ♦ Pets
- Personal Electronics— We strongly recommend that you have your Scouts leave these items in your vehicle and do not bring to the campsite so that they can fully enjoy the camping experience.
