Scouts BSA:

Build your own First Aid Kit – Page 108 in the Boy Scout Handbook, also requirement 4D for Tenderfoot.

Build out your own personal first aid kit for camping and travel. If you’ve already built your kit, go through it and make sure you have all the items recommended and replace any that you’ve used.

Knife Safety – Pages 378-381. Review rules for knife and tool safety.

Alternative – Attend your Troop's virtual meeting, or take an online merit badge course. (This can be completed anytime during the challenge.)

Adult Leaders and Parents:

Take Position Specific Training on Scouting U – Take the position specific training for your adult leader position. Ex. Den Leader, Committee Member, Treasurer. Scouting U Link – your login will be the same as my.scouting.org – Click on My Training and select Training Center to see a list of courses.

Alternatives: If you have already taken your position specific training, pick another module and complete it. Parents, consider taking either Den Leader Training or Committee Member Training to better understand and help out your Pack.
