Registration is by payment of 100% of total unit fees, only in the name of a registered Cub Scout. No registrations are excepted for individuals who are not a registered member of BSA.

Schedule

The registered adults will be in charge of registering for completion of the group registration for selection of activity choices. All Registered Webelos in your group will make session selections as a group. All Registered AOL's Scouts will make session selections as a group. So if you register Webelos and AOL's, you will have two separate schedules – one for each group. Please make one secondary choice just in case the 1st choice section is full. Final schedule will be provided at checkin on Sunday!

Choices:

Webelos will take Aquanuat on Monday and Paddle Onward on Tuesday

AOLs will take Swimming on Monday and Paddle Craft on Tuesday

<u>Aquanaut & Swimming</u> – offers basic swimming and rescue techniques in our camp pool with our trained aquatics staff. Aquanaut/Swimming is only offered on Monday and is a requirement for Paddle Onward/Paddle Craft on Tuesday.

<u>Paddle Onward & Paddle Craft</u> – takes place at our waterfront. This class offers the Scouts the opportunity to learn new skills including canoeing and kayaking. Aquanaut/Swimming is a prerequist for Paddle Onward & Paddle Craft. Also, Scout must have be a qualified swimmer (passed the BSA Swimminer test) to participate. If they fail to pass the Swimmer test, participants will be allowed to hang out in the non-swimmer location at the lakefront. Paddle Onward & Paddle Craft will only be offered on Tuesday.

Prerequisites:

- Aquanaut/Swimming
- Pass BSA Swim Test (all swim tests will be given on Sunday after arrival at camp)

Electives offered:

Scouts will complete one elective per rotation period.

Webelos:

<u>Build It</u> – Scouts will work with our Summer Camp staff at our Handicrafts shelter to learn about tools, their proper use, and safety. They will also plan and build a project while at camp as well as learn about a career in construction. If they sign up for this elective, they will take it both Monday and Tuesday to complete all requirements.

<u>Catch the Big One</u> – Scouts will learn about planning a fishing trip, the gear needed to fish, the best knot to use to attache their hook and spend an hour fishing off our levee.

<u>Tech on the trail</u> – Scouts will learn about GPS and how to use it while moving about in the outdoors. They will use what they learn to go on a hike.

<u>Yo-Yo</u> – Scouts will learn about all about yo-yo's as well as some fun tricks to show off when they get back home.

AOL:

<u>Engineer</u> – Scouts will learn about blueprints and what goes into building a project. They will choose a project they can build at camp (similar to what they will learn in the pioneering merit badge in Scouts BSA) and build it.

<u>Fishing</u> - Scouts will learn about planning a fishing trip, the gear needed to fish, the best knot to use to attache their hook and spend an hour fishing off our levee.

Into the Woods – Scouts will learn about trees, plants and wildlife at Camp Vbar.

<u>Knife Safety</u> – Scouts will learn about knife safety, how to use a knife properly and learn how to carve with a knife.

• Prerequisite: Scouts must bring a pocket knife with them to camp. Please make sure that the knife is properly scarpened before they arrive at camp.

Fun Options:

Fun Options will be added to your schedule.

<u>Shooting Sports</u> – Scouts will spend time at the shooting ranges. They will be able to choose to go to both BB's and Archery or spend all their time at just one range. Scouts will learn how to properly use a BB gun and/or Bow and arrow, the different parts of the equipment, etc. This knowledge will help them when they crossover to Scouts BSA if they wish to earn the Rifle, Shotgun, Archery or Shooting Sports Merit Badges. Scouts will be able to complete their BB Gun & Archery electives at camp.

<u>Climbing Tower</u> – Scouts will be able to spend time at the Camp VBar climbing tower under the supervision of our trained climbing staff. They will learn about climbing equipment, the knots that are important for climbing, how to properly ascend and decend the tower. Think of it as a stepping stone to the Climbing Merit Badge that they can earn once they cross over to Scouts BSA

Actual schedules will be assembled by staff after registration closes and will be based on number of registrants. Schedules will be emailed to Den Leaders in advance of camp.

Other Camp Activities:

As with Scouts BSA Summer Camp, there will be additional fun activities provided by our staff during camp.

Helpful Hints to make Cub Camping easier on everyone

- Recruit a Pack Coordinator to gather information about the event, relay information to the parents, collect registration moneys from parents, and register EVERYONE who is attending through Council website.
 - i. Makes it easier to know who is attending
 - ii. Allows the Pack to use "Scout" account funds to register individuals
 - iii. Eliminates participants need for refunds, etc.
- 2. Announce the event at your meetings well in advance of the deadline as well as publish in your monthly calendars and emails to members.
- 3. Set a specific window for registration through the Pack. Make sure if you are doing it through an electronic portal that someone is monitoring it and double checks it before your Pack registration deadline so that everyone is registered with Council
- 4. Schedule a "Load & Prep" day the before campout. Members meet at your meeting site or a member house to load the Pack trailer with all of the gear for the camping trip. It also means that members will not have to carry their own camping supplies down the hill to their campsites.
- 5. Plan a meeting location on the 1st day of campout and plan for everyone to leave for camp at the same time. If you convoy up to camp, everyone arrives at the same time. This makes it easier for the newbies to know where to go and what to do as well as making it easier to set up camp.
- 6. When you arrive at camp as a group, institute a rule that no one goes off to play until everyone's tent is set up. The Scouts should be helping to set up camp as this is one of the skills they will need once they cross over to Scouts BSA. It is amazing how quickly they will get things set up when they are motivated. When they finish with their tent, have them help a friend with theirs, help set up any additional items, gather firewood. All of these items go into setting up camp and shouldn't fall just on the adults.
- 7. Have a quick safety talk with your Pack once everyone has arrived. Discuss the camp rules, fire safety rules, what time lights out occurs, the location of the health lodge and any other safety rules that are specific to your Pack.
- 8. Sanity Hint If you have camped with Cub Scouts before, you realize that one of the first things they do is fine a stick to use as a walking stick for the campout and then spend the rest of the time arguing over whose stick is whose or crying because someone else picked up their stick and walked off with it. Here is a solution to save your sanity purchase several rolls of the thin, decorative duct tape. Put them on a string and attach that string to your belt or backpack. When they find a stick, let them pick 3-4 styles/colors of duct tape to wrap around their stick and decorate it. It makes the stick identifiable, prevents others from picking it up and reduces the arguments over who "owns" the stick.
- 9. Before you leave camp for activities, have an equipment check. Does everyone have their water bottle, proper shoes, sunscreen, hat, backpack to carry everything. Make sure their backpacks to not contain too much. Otherwise, you will have Scouts complaining rather quickly.
- 10. Last but not least, remember that you are supposed to be having fun. If the Scouts don't know that something went wrong and wasn't what you planned but are still having fun anyway, don't worry about it. Make a note of what you could have done different and make the change next time but enjoy the moment for what it is. Before you know it, you will be attending their Eagle Court of Honor.
