Patricia Denechaud - Pat is President and CEO of Crescent City Consultants and Honorary Consul of Canada in Louisiana. She serves on numerous community boards. She is Founder of the New Orleans Affiliate of the Komen for the Cure Foundation. She is on the board of the New Orleans Chamber of Commerce and served as first female Chairman. She is past Chairman and member of the board of LSU Health Sciences Center Foundation. Additionally, she is an Advisory Board member of the World Trade Center and was the organizations first female President. Pat has been a Co-Chair if the Pillars of Scouting event since it's inception and was Chair of many Golden Eagle Luncheons prior to that. Pat has raised well

over a million dollars to support Scouting's youth develop programs and is a member of the Southeast Louisiana Council Boy Scouts of America.



John F. Heaton, M.D. - John is the President and Chief Medical Officer of LCMC Health. A graduate of Nicholls State University and the LSU School of Medicine in New Orleans, Dr. Heaton is a diplomate of the American Board of Anesthesiology.
