SELA Mission

- The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law
- The purpose of the Southeast Louisiana Council from the bylaws:

The Corporation shall promote, within the territory covered by the charter from time to time granted it by the Boy Scouts of America and in accordance with the Congressional Charter, Bylaws, and Rules and Regulations of the Boy Scouts of America, and the Local Council charter granted by the Boy Scouts of America, the Scouting program of promoting the ability of all youth irrespective of gender to do things for themselves and others, training them in Scoutcraft, and teaching them patriotism, courage, selfreliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by the Boy Scouts of America. In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon the educational program of the Boy Scouts of America and the oath, promise, and code of the Scouting program for character development, citizenship training, leadership, and mental and physical fitness.

The Corporation shall fulfill the basic purpose of the Scouting movement within its territory, making Scouting training available to all youth irrespective of gender and serving organizations and community groups using the Scouting program while maintaining standards and policies, protecting official badges and insignia, and reviewing and making recommendations regarding unit leadership and finances.

- Who: VP of Membership, District Executives, District Committees

• Goal #2 - Unit Growth

- 5% total unit growth per year (Current 131, goal 150)
- 1 new Unit per district per year and have overall positive unit growth each year (Net gain)

Program

- GOAL #1 Strengthen and increase participation in camping and outdoor programs by development of additional Council and District-level youth events.
 - Increase the number of district camporees yearly
 - Develop a council camporee
 - Increase Scout (more Shoot, Swim, Climb) and Cub overnighters
 - Who: Council and District Program Committees
- GOAL #2 Increase participation by adult leaders in available online and inperson training opportunities to strengthen percentage of trained, direct contact leaders.
 - Become 100% YPT compliant
 - Provide more program-specific training (Shooting Sports, Aquatics, etc.)
 - Communicate expectation for adult training by Unit Commissioner involvement and improved messaging
 - Who: Council and District YPT Champions and Training Committees, Unit Commissioners

Program

- GOAL #3 Develop and promote more activities and community service events at unit and District levels to bolster civic engagement by Council youth.
 - Promote four civic engagement events per year
 - Foster cooperation between Districts to develop events
 - Who: Council and District Activities Committees, Program Committee

Camp/Properties

- Goal #1 Prioritize and complete needed repairs and improvements to existing physical plant
 - Top 5 include: Climbing Tower, Dining Hall Roof, Roads, Dam, Staff Lodge
 - Upgrade facilities to deliver better program
 - Who: Properties Committee, Program Committee, Ranger, Finance Committee
- Goal #2 Implement and utilize facility management software tool to create better institutional memory and manage maintenance
 - Employ the FIIX software by the end of 2023
 - Who: Properties Committee, Ranger
- Goal #3 Become revenue break-even within 5 years
 - By establishing a camp endowment to fund camp maintenance and development
 - Expand outside-group usage of camp
 - Explore additional revenue streams including solar and carbon credits
 - Who: Properties Committee, Board, Risk Management Committee
- Goal #4 Develop a Camp Master Plan
 - Develop consistent branding for buildings and facilities
 - Identify future development/program areas
 - Who: Properties and Program Committees, Ranger, Executive Board



FIIX software implementation in process

Finance/Endowment

- Goal #1 Maintain a balanced budget annually for the operating account, with no additional reliance on Endowment fund beyond the standard 5% allotment
 - Increase the Endowment
 - Increase FOS contributions
 - Develop at least one fundraiser for each District yearly
 - Who: Finance and Fundraising Committee, Executive Board, District Committees
- Goal #2 Reduce the Council Program Fee by 50% to \$20 for 2023 and 2024, and reduce to \$0 for 2025 and beyond.

Program fee remains at \$20

- Who: Key 4 and Finance Committee
- Goal #3 Establish a campaign to reach Eagle Alumni residing in the Council to raise new funds for operations in tandem with a focus on online fundraising.
 - Engage affinity groups (NESA, Scouting Alumni Organization)
 - Develop a capability for on-line giving
 - Who: Key 4, Finance Committee, Fundraising Committee, Alumni Committee
- Goal #4 Initiate an Endowment campaign with potential donors to boost the Endowment fund.
 - Identify Endowment Drive Champion
 - 25 James E. West Recipients per year within the council and all Board members
 - Double the current Endowment to \$5 million
 - Who: Key 4, Council Board, Endowment Committee

Board / Governance

- Goal #1 To formulate a succession plan for organizational leadership to include the recruiting and training of the next generation of board members
 - Create a document for new members
 - Have a standardized onboarding procedure
 - Yearly evaluation of each member
 - Yearly board retreat for new members
 - Who: Board Committee on Onboarding, Key 4, Council Nominating Committee
- Goal #2 To review the current bylaws and propose any amendments that might be needed
 - To review the current listing of Executive Board Vice-Presidents and determine the best practice use of them
 - Expand the role of the RIsk Management Committee into educating, reputation management
 - Who: Risk Management Committee, Board Committee on Bylaws
- Goal #3 To strategize on board identity going forward and define a vison for the future role the Executive Board
 - The board must reflect our community
 - Add members from NO East, West Bank, Terrebonne and Assumption Parishes
 - Who: Key 4/Board Committee on Bylaws, Executive Board, Council Nominating Committee
